# Masterplan continues to evolve after consultation

Dear Resident,

Thank you to everyone who contributed to our first public consultation in June, July and August 2008 on our proposals for the future of Battersea Power Station. Following REO's purchase of the site in December 2006, the team and I have taken on the challenge of developing a comprehensive, deliverable and innovative masterplan.

As part of the first phase in our ongoing programme of public consultation we welcomed over 14,000 visitors to the site to view our masterplan, the majority being local residents.

Feedback from the exhibition was very positive, with high levels of support for our plans. Two thirds of respondents to our questionnaire said that they were supportive of the proposed masterplan for the site, 81% liked the design and 87% supported the plan to extend the Northern Line from Kennington to a new station at Battersea.

Following this consultation process, a revised masterplan was published in December 2008, which addressed many of the issues raised.

Since then, we have received further comments from the local community, Wandsworth, the GLA, CABE and English Heritage. We are currently reviewing that feedback, and the masterplan continues to evolve in discussion with these stakeholders. I hope to provide a further update on this 'work in progress' in the next few weeks.

We have also been busy continuing to maintain and protect the Power Station, as well as enabling the site to be opened up for filming and events.

## An ongoing programme of restoration and safety



A £2,000,000 programme of remedial works has been underway on the power station since July 2007. The objective is to create safe access and slow down deterioration of the building through extensive roof, drainage and brick repairs. Works are being carried out by a restoration contractor in close liaison with English Heritage.



### Working with our local schools

In association with Wandsworth Council's Education team, we held a programme of workshops for secondary schools in Wandsworth, as part of the science and geography curriculum. Local schools taking advantage of the programme included Battersea Park School and Salesian College, plus schools from other parts of Wandsworth. Pupils were introduced to the opportunities and difficulties associated with redeveloping a site such as Battersea Power Station, were shown how the masterplan for the site has evolved, and donned hard hats and high vis jackets for a walk around the power station. Councillors Kathy Tracey (Cabinet Member for Children's Services) and Peter Dawson (Deputy Mayor) joined a school workshop on 4th December, and were impressed by the students' imaginative plans for the site. We are hoping that more workshops, including local primary schools, will be arranged in 2009.
